

Board Membership by Category

Below is a listing of board membership according to CLAM's tripartite board structure. Like many other Community Land Trusts, CLAM has a board structure that aims to ensure a balance of interests and perspectives on the board. The description of each of the 3 categories is listed below. While CLAM strives to preserve a balance of board members in each category of board structure (ie, Lessee, General Member, and Public Representative), the actual number of board members occupying each category is also dependent on the nomination process, and individuals able to serve. If you are a CLAM member, you can nominate a person(s) to the Resident and General Member categories. These nominees will meet with our nominating committee to learn about the responsibilities of Board service. Should they accept, they can be voted upon by the membership at CLAM's annual meeting on May 20th, 2018. The Board itself nominates those in the Public Representative category, though we welcome suggestions from the membership. The entire proposed board slate is shared on our website one week in advance of the annual meeting. Bylaws articulate a board of 12-15 members.

Resident or "Lessee" Member Category

This includes anyone who rents or owns a CLAM Home, any CLAM member who rents in CLAM's service area of West Marin (Tomales, Marshall, Point Reyes, Olema, Inverness Park, Inverness, Stinson Beach), or any CLAM member who holds a position to represent the interests of those who would benefit from a CLAM home (example: school personnel, community service staff, healthcare staff, etc).
